



## THE CORONATION OF KING CHARLES III - May 6th 2023

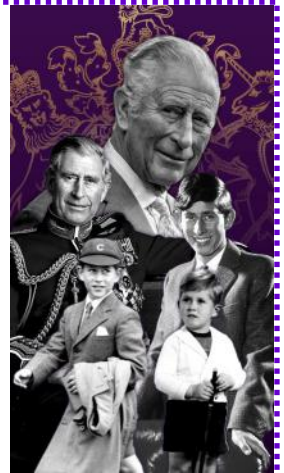
I don't know about you but, after 70 years, I'm still adjusting to hearing references to 'The King' in the news, instead of 'The Queen'. So imagine what an adjustment it must be for King Charles, having been the longest serving Heir Apparent in English history and the oldest to assume the throne!

Born in 1947, it says a lot about the life path prescribed for him that, instead of announcing the birth of a baby boy, Buckingham Place declared that 'Princess Elizabeth has been safely delivered of a Prince'. He became the heir to the throne at the age of three on the death of his grandfather and the accession of his mother, the late Queen Elizabeth II.

As Prince Charles, he was the first British Heir Apparent to go to school, at Cheam and Gordonstoun, the first to go to University, at Cambridge, and the first to earn a degree. He was made the Prince of Wales in 1958, at the age of 9, though his investiture wasn't until 1969, just before his 21st birthday.

From his early years, Charles had a passion for the natural world. Much teased for once saying that he talked to his plants, his gardens at Highgrove are now an international visitor attraction. His early concerns about the environment proved to be prescient and have guided much of his work. "By understanding the balance, the order and the relationships between ourselves and the natural world we can create a more sustainable future."

### Annual Parish Meeting

The Parish Council wishes to thank members of the public for attending the 126<sup>th</sup> Assembly of Electors at its Annual Parish Meeting which took place at the end of April. There is always an opportunity to raise concerns about something in your neighbourhood and if you missed the chance to come along to this annual meeting, members of the public are always welcome to come to the monthly meetings. ### Community Sports Pavilion

Next month sees the opening of the new Community Sports Pavilion. Despite the endless rain in March, the contractors kept on target and on schedule. The project would not have been possible without the incredibly generous donations from so many parishioners and local people and the Council wish to thank each and every one of you. Your generosity along with the grant from YFS have created a brand new Pavilion fit for the 21<sup>st</sup> century. The grand opening will take place on the day of the Summer Fair - Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> June, and we hope that everyone will come along and look inside this wonderful new building.



### War Memorial Restoration

The Council has begun the restoration of the Grade II War Memorial which stands in the St Michael's churchyard. This is a major capital investment for the Council. The Calvary Cross and figure have been carefully removed from site to be restored at a master craftsman's workshop leaving behind the Portland stone surround and engraved tablets. These have been gently steam cleaned and will await the return of the wooden memorial. This was designed by Frederick Brook Hitch (1897-1957), a prominent British sculptor and there are many other significant memorials around the country by this celebrated artist. The Pirbright memorial was unveiled on 13 August 1920 by the Bishop of Guildford to commemorate the 48 men from the village who fell in the First World war and a further engraved tablet added following the Second World War. The Council have sought a grant for some of the cost of the restoration through the War Memorial's Trust who are guiding the work. The wooden cross had extensive rot and the figure of Christ had also begun to perish. It is hoped the restoration will ensure the village benefit from this important War Memorial for decades to come.

## MAY GARDENING TIPS from Wellie

After the extremely dry summer last year and the very cold temperatures in December many plants are looking a little (perhaps an understatement in some cases!) dead. Plants I have noticed that have suffered are Pittosporum, hebes, Penstamon, Salvia, Rosemary, Bay and Choisya. If you can put up with looking at these sad plants a while longer you might find that they rejuvenate from lower down the plant, but this takes time and you might not see anything until early summer. If the frost damage has just caused the top-most leaves to turn brown, eg Bay trees, at the end of this month, when risk of frosts have gone, prune out the damaged growth by cutting back to an undamaged side shoot, give the plant a multi purpose feed afterwards. If plants are showing no signs of life, then perhaps use this opportunity to go shopping and buy some new plants, but perhaps be aware that these extreme temperatures might happen again. Plant out summer bedding at the end of the month but watch out for late frosts and if necessary

cover tender plants. Lift and divide overcrowded Spring bulbs, trim back Aubrietia and Sweet Alyssum after flowering to tidy them up and encourage fresh new growth. Hoe beds regularly to keep on top of the weeds. Put supports in (if not already done so) for herbaceous plants that need extra support. Spring flowering shrubs can be pruned after they have flowered but check for nesting birds before attempting this. Mow lawns weekly now, apply a weed, feed and moss treatment if not already done. Think about leaving some areas of lawn to grow, allowing wild plants already in the lawn to flower which adds colour and attracts pollinating insects. Earth up potatoes as they grow to protect early shoots from frost damage and to ensure the potato tubers are not exposed to light.
