Looking around the glorious gardens of Cunningham House, one would imagine that we have full time professional gardeners working tirelessly several days each month. However, like so much else at Cunningham House, we enjoy the talents of dedicated volunteers who have a passion for gardening and a love of our House. Anne Collins, Hilary Gower and Gill Denyer (with the help of a paid gardener to do some of the heavy work) have, over the years, transformed our sloping, sandy site into a series of flower beds that feature shape, colour and texture all year round. Between them, they have tilled our soil and planted beautiful flowers, trees and bushes weekly for a combined 63+ years!

Each Wednesday morning, these three friends meet to work in our gardens. Led by Anne, a trained horticulturist, the team weed, mulch, trim, and transform. The challenges of the site and the vagaries of the weather keep them on their toes; lately there has been frost damage to clear away, requiring either heavy use of secateurs or a large fork if the affected plant is a lost cause. Last summer it was drought, which was especially hard on newer plants.





Where the ground and tree cover have made it impossible to keep a lawn, the team have been creative in building a feature using decorative stones and a birdbath. As each resident has her/his own flower bed, the gardeners kindly work with the residents to help them get the most of their "private gardens".
