Pirbright War Memorial

Thanks to Vice Chair of PPC, Cllr Lindsay Graham for giving a reading at the Remembrance Sunday service. It was



fantastic to see the
War Memorial once
again playing a pivotal role. The cost of
the repairs to the oak
figure, oak cross,
Portland stone plinth
and horizontal name
slabs was almost

£16.000. Thanks to the War Memorials Trust, 50% of this will be in the form of a grant. The Parish Council will cover the remainder as part of the Precept (the council tax each Parishioner pays). £8,000 is 10% of the parish council's entire budget so it is a significant amount, but PPC believe the memorial is an important part of Pirbright's identity and must be maintained. The Bishop of Guildford will be coming to St Michaels & All Angels to bless the newly reinstated War Memorial on Sunday 29th December. His predecessor, John Randolph (1866-1936), originally unveiled the Memorial on 13th August 1920 so it seemed fitting that the current Bishop perform the blessing.

PIRBIGHT HISTORIANS

You might raise a glass of Christmas Cheer this month in one of Pirbright's four pubs. But what about the other pub – the 19th century one called The Swallow on the site of the current Newmans on the Guildford Road, by Swallow Pond? The land was bought c1850 by a Morris Ashby, whose family owned a brewery in Staines. By 1856 The Swallow was operating as a "beerhouse" – presumably selling Ashby's beer. The landlord of the time, a William Warner, was fined that year for having "deficient weights and measures", ie short-changing his customers. Maybe this was merely an oversight on William's part. The pub closed in the late 1880s for reasons unknown and was converted into two cottages.

This painting dates from 1886, but since then we have had to manage with just four pubs in Pirbright.

I was sitting down to write my garden piece for December and for whatever reason it came into my head to try and find 12 plants that represent the song Twelve days of Christmas.....So here goes.



- First Day a partridge in a pear tree Pyrus communis (pear tree) I know, an easy first one!
- Second Day two turtle doves Davidia Involucrata also known as Dove tree/handkerchief tree
- Third Day three French hens Sempervivum (house leek) also known as Hen and Chicks
- Fourth Day four colly or calling birds Lotus corniculatus (Birdsfoot trefoil)
- Fifth Day five gold rings Berberis thunbergii 'Golden Ring'
- Sixth Day six geese a laying Ribes uva crispa (Gooseberry) ok, not the best, but all I could find.
- Seventh Day seven swans a swimming Gomphocarpus physocarpus (swan plant)
- Eighth Day eight maids a milking Cardamine pratensis (milkmaids/Cuckoo flower)
- Ninth Day nine ladies dancing Onicidum orchids (Dancing ladies)
- Tenth Day ten lords a leaping Arum maculatum (Lords and Ladies)
- Eleventh Day eleven pipers piping Piper ornatum (Pepper vine)
- Twelfth Day twelve drummers drumming Moringa oleifera (Drumstick plant)
