This car park is owned by the Parish Council and was opened to parents for drop-off and pick-up to ease congestion on School Lane. The resurfacing was made possible with grants from both Cllr Keith Witham (Pirbright) and Cllr Ayesha Azad (Brookwood) as we recognise that the car park is heavily used by parents of both villages.

News from Lord Pirbright's Hall

As we welcome in the New Year, we reflect on the ups and downs of the old one, which have included an emergency replacement of the central heating boilers and the long-awaited installation of a modern cooker. We had consulted our

regular users and professional caterers about this and, with thanks to a generous grant from Peribus, the new cooker arrived before Christmas. More improvements are planned for the kitchen during the coming months.

We have also been successful in obtaining a 50% grant from the Rural England Prosperity Fund to replace the outer kitchen door, the door at the south exit, and the doors to the under-stage storage area. We shall be carrying out the work in the first quarter of this year.

We are also planning minor improvements at the community sports pavilion to make it more user-friendly for hirers during the winter months, with thanks for practical suggestions from the Twinning Association's trial run, their Beaujolais Supper in November. We would love to welcome more regular use of the Pavilion by village groups and ad hoc hirers, and we would invite suggestions about the formation of new clubs – bridge, photography or books, for example. Alexander Barracks, Pirbright – Construction Works

The Army is investing in Alexander Barracks to support basic training at Pirbright. The Defence Estate Optimisation (Army) Programme - known as DEO Army - is improving facilities for Service personnel, reducing running costs across the estate and supporting military capability.

The Alexander Barracks project will provide enhanced living, working and training accommodation, including modern recruit accommodation, a swimming pool and gym. Construction is due to start in 2026 and be completed in 2032. A detailed traffic plan will minimise disruption to the local area.

PIRBRIGHT HISTORIANS

To continue last month's theme of Christmas Cheer, we now turn our attention to The Fox at Fox Corner. It first opened in 1862, on the site of a shoemaker's house on a piece of land called (for reasons unknown) "Gander Hill". It served beers from the well-known Simonds Brewery in Reading, which then bought the pub (in 1882) and continued to run it, until the company merged with Courage in 1960. Walter Liley (1911-46) and Eric Gosden (1946-65) were the best known landlords during this time. During the 1980s Courage sold The Fox to one of the new "Pubco's", but thankfully it is now owned privately by a local resident. The photos show The Fox c1900 and c1910 (complete with local Aldershot & District bus service). Cheers!

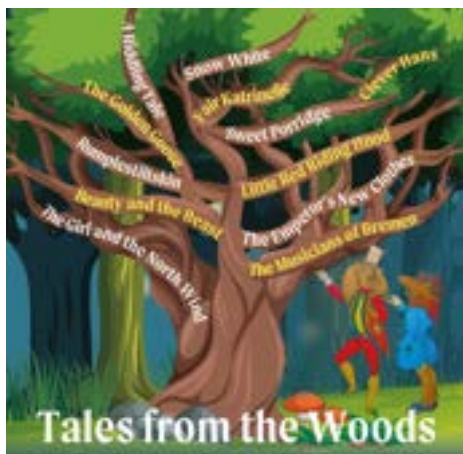

JANUARY GARDENING TIPS from Wellie

Time to plan what you want to do to your garden over the coming year, look at seed catalogues and order your seeds. Wash pots and seed trays so they are clean and ready for using in the coming year. Clean your greenhouse to let in more light over the winter months. Cut back deciduous grasses to allow new shoots to emerge freely. Plant bare-rooted trees and shrubs now. Cut back foliage of helleborus to show off their beautiful flowers.

Sow early peas such as 'Feltham First' for harvesting in May/June. Broad beans can be sown inside now, to plant out in February. Prune gooseberries and

redcurrants, apples and pears, wisteria and roses now. Force rhubarb to encourage faster growth. Put out food and water for birds to encourage them into your garden. What to do with your Christmas tree? Did you know that donkeys, goats and alpacas enjoy eating Christmas trees, which are either fir, pine or spruce and are a great source of vitamin C and antioxidants for them....who knew! But never feed animals without checking with the owner first!
