A Prayer for the Start of Term


Dear God





Pirbright Parish Council

The Parish Council welcomed Al Pinkerton MP to the village last

month. Al was cycling around his constituency and travelled from Normandy to Pirbright with PPC Chair, Cllr David Woollett. Al came to Lord Pirbright's Hall to meet residents and find out about their local concerns. The Parish Council has carried out works to improve the condition of the Avenue De Cagny car park with pot holes filled and the car park bays re-lined. These works were paid for from the Precept at a cost of £2,007. Surrey Highways also repainted the



road tables along White Hart Corner leading to Cemetery Pales. These works were kindly funded by Cllr Keith Witham, our County Councillor, at a cost of £1,762.

The Parish Council has also taken time to repair some of the play-ground equipment, with treads on the roundabout and the running boards on the rocking horse being replaced. Minor repairs to the slide were also carried out. These repairs were paid for from the Precept at a cost of £494.78. A qualified Parish Councillor inspects the playground equipment weekly and the Council contracts the British Engineering Group to carry out its annual inspection at a cost to the Precept of £416 pa. The Parish Council has, this year, also contracted to Sovereign Ltd to carry out additional bi-annual inspections to give an extra level of safety.

You may have noticed the new barrier gate onto the main green close to the car park. The drop bollards were continually failing and were in need of replacing with a more practical solution. The new barrier was installed at a cost to the Precept of £1,098 and stands to protect the main green which is beginning to look a lot better.

Finally, the Council would like to thank Mark Tidy who is contracted to keep the grassed area immediately around the War Memorial in the churchyard looking so well maintained all year round. The Parish Council is proud to be the custodian of such a special memorial to the fallen.

September Eco Tip

Sustainable September is a month-long campaign dedicated to encouraging individuals, communities, and organisations to take meaningful steps toward more sustainable living. It's a time to reflect on our environmental impact and explore practical ways to reduce waste, lower carbon emissions, protect biodiversity, and promote ecoconscious choices in everyday life. From food and fashion to travel and energy use, Sustainable September invites us all to be part of the solution to the climate crisis.

September Gardening Tips

Make the most of the warmth in the air and soil, before the temperatures drop at the beginning of Autumn. To help grapes ripen, remove leaves shading fruit. Check if there are any heavy laden branches on fruit trees that need supporting. Pinch out tops of tomatoes, remove any new flowers, and remove any growth below the lowest fruit and growth shading fruit. Earth up brussel sprouts to prevent damage from wind. Earth up leeks to increase length of white stems. Dig up potatoes before slug damage spoils them. Finish trimming hedges by mid September. Perennials that have finished flowering can be divided now if they have become congested. Cut back flowered stems of jasmine. Climbing roses can be pruned now after they have flowered. Plant bulbs for spring display. Sow grass seed or lay new turf this month. Apply an autumn weed and feed to your lawns. As the weather cools begin to scarify, aerate and top dress. Cut summer flowering meadows after they have gone to seed. Leave cuttings for a few days to allow remaining seeds to fall, then rake up so that the cuttings are not left to enrich the ground. Net ponds now before the leaves start to fall. Don't be too hasty to cut everything down after it has finished flowering. Carry on filling your bird feeders. If you have sunflowers, don't be tempted to clear them away, leave the seed heads for birds to feed on. Keep bird baths clean and full of water. Leave food out for hedgehog visitors.
